# From the Desk of ... John Ford, SGBI Executive Director

Recently, I had the opportunity to sit down and review the notes taken at the Annual Membership Meeting Marketing Roundtable, an activity focused on strengthening affiliate sales. As I poured over member comments and observations, it became clear that one word plays a major role in affiliate sale success, CONSISTENCY.

The importance of producing and offering buyers a consistent product was mentioned numerous times during the member discussion. It was pointed

out that producing a product for a market rather than producing a product and trying to find a market are two separate activities. In the past, most seedstock producers have taken the approach of producing a product with little thought given to customer wants and needs. For success in today's seedstock industry and long-term viability, affiliate sales must target markets more effectively and consistently produce the type and kind of cattle that meet the specifications called for from the targeted customer.

In today's data driven beef industry, it is essential that SGBI members collect and submit data following the association's Performance Committee guidelines in a consistent manner and the data be displayed in sale catalogs correctly and in-line with the association's genetic evaluation and datasets.

Consistency was also mentioned as the roundtable discussion became more focused on the actual mechanics of conducting a sale. It was pointed out a venue that provides the proper environment for the targeted customer base has value. Conducting the event at the same venue every year on the same date has merit. There is comfort in consistency, and it is easier to attract targeted customers if the marketing event is held at the same location on the same date at the same time. This consistency is key to getting past buyers back in the sale bleachers.

Communication with potential buyers must also be consistent. Ad campaigns must be uniform in both format and message. If the intent is to attract commercial cattlemen, the message must focus on the traits that matter to this customer base. The same holds true if the targeted customer base are junior exhibitors. Regardless, of the targeted customer base, the sale message must be consistent and presented in a uniform format.

Does consistency ensure success for every sale every year? No, probably not. We all realize there are numerous factors that contribute to a sale being successful, many outside the control of sale managers.

However, producing a consistent product, backed by sound data collected and analyzed in a consistent manner, offered annually at the same venue, and marketed to a targeted audience with a clear and consistent message will certainly strengthen affiliate sale efforts.




