John Allen Carleston



John Allen Carleston, 73, of Louise, died Monday, May 18, 2009. He was born March 6, 1936 in Navasota to Herbert C. Sr. and Vivian Allen Carleston. He graduated from Giddings High School in 1954, attended Navarro Junior College, Blinn College, and graduated from Southwest Texas State University with a B.S. in Agriculture Science. Mr. Carleston married Helen Fowler on August 19, 1956.

He taught vocational agriculture at Crescent High School from 1959-1960 and at Louise High School from 1960-1992. Mr. Carleston was named Educator of the Year in 1984. He organized the Louise Young Farmers Chapter, served on the VATAT Board of Directors for five years, was president of the Boy Builders of Wharton County for nine years, and served as chairman of the Youth Livestock Division at Wharton County Youth Fair for three years.

He was on the Wharton County Area Go-Texan Committee at the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo for four years, on the HLS&R Steer Show Committee and was assistant superintendent of Breeding Beef at the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo. He was a member of the Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis Association, served on the board of directors of Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis Association, served as youth director of Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis Association, chairman of the Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis Junior Heifer Show, member of the Santa Gertrudis Breeders International, and served on the youth committee of the Santa Gertrudis Breeders International. He was inducted into the Wall of Fame of the Houston Livestock Show & Rodeo in 2007.

Mr. Carleston was a deacon and member of First Baptist Church in Louise. He treasured his Lord, his wife, and his family. He loved his Santa Gertrudis cattle and earned the respect of many young people across the U.S. through FFA and the National Junior Santa Gertrudis Association.

Survivors include his wife, Helen Fowler Carleston of Louise; daughters, Debra Townsend and husband Ivan of Louise and Cynthia Blaha and husband Stanley Jr. of El Campo; grandchildren, Tanya Bram and husband Craig, Tana Townsend, Clint Blaha, and Caydi Blaha; one great-grandson, Caleb Bram; brother, Herbert C. Carleston Jr.; sister-in-law and brother in law, Geneva and Russell Bayh Jr., and numerous nieces, nephews, and cousins. He was preceded in death by his parents; mother in-law and father in-law, Norma and Henry Fowler; and sister in-law, Joyce Carleston.

Visitation was held Wednesday, May 20 at noon at Triska Funeral Home. Funeral services were held Thursday, May 21 at 2 p.m. at First Baptist Church in El Campo with the Rev. Larry Van Hook and the Rev. Jerre Guthrie officiating. Burial followed at Garden of Memories Cemetery in El Campo. Pallbearers were Darwin Bayh, Rusty Bayh, Tom DuBois, Allen Grainger, Larry Justiss, Jerome Urbanosky, H.O. "Buzzy" Keith, Roger Melton, John Mikolajczak, and Wylie Taliaferro. 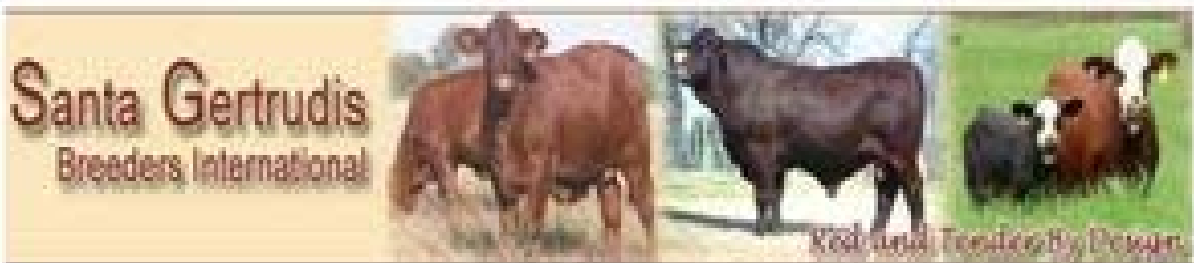

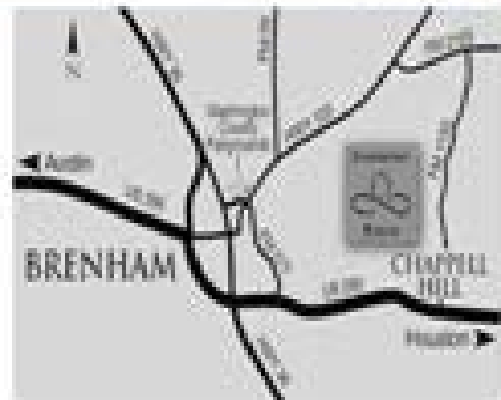

Fast Beef Facts Shalene McNeill, Ph.D., R.D.

Lean beef is considered nutrient-rich because it packs a powerhouse of essential nutrients that benefits people of all ages in maintaining both day-to-day and long-term health.

A 3 ounce serving of beef is an excellent source of [protein](#), [zinc](#), [vitamin B12](#), [selenium](#) and [phosphorus](#) and a good source of [niacin](#), [vitamin B6](#), [iron](#) and [riboflavin](#).

- This is quite a nutritional bargain, as a 3 ounce serving of lean beef contributes less than 10 percent of calories to a 2,000-calorie diet while providing 51 percent of the protein, 38 percent of the zinc and 37 percent of the vitamin B12 we need every day.
- Beef supplies high-quality protein, complete with nine essential amino acids.
- Beef is one of the most important dietary sources of iron. To obtain the same amount of iron found in a 3 ounce serving of beef, you'd have to eat at least 3 cups of raw spinach.
- A 3 ounce serving of beef provides 38 percent of the Daily Value for zinc. You would need to eat more than eleven 3 ounce servings of tuna to get the same amount of zinc in one 3 ounce serving of beef.
- Beef contains significant amounts of the [B-complex vitamins](#), riboflavin, niacin, [thiamin](#), B6 and B12.

Christy works at Blue Bell Creameries as the Research and Development Manager and has completed 11 years doing work in ice cream product development, nutrition labeling, sensory evaluation and consumer affairs. Christy currently lives in Brenham, Texas with her husband David and 2 children, Madison Claire (age 3 1/2 and Dawson Cade (age 9 months).

Jason Miller has been raising Santa Gertrudis since the 1980's after purchasing several to show while growing up in Palacios. Currently Helacious 750 is a Jerome Urbanosky raised bull who is setting the future path for their breeding program. Jerome is an approved SGBI judge and has been selected to judge such events as the North American Livestock Expo, the Mid-South Fair, the Ozark Empire Show, the Georgia National Show, to name a few.

The Cattle Show featuring Santa Gertrudis Cattle

The Cattle Show along with *Ag Lifestyles* are half-hour programs produced by L.Z. The shows are a way for her to give recognition to those individuals that she admires most, the ranchers, as well as allow her to journey to different ranches across the nation, visiting with country people who welcome L.Z. into their life and share their knowledge. Talks began with RFD-TV in 2001 and *The Cattle Show* was launched in September of 2002, with the Santa Gertrudis joining in the filming during January 2008. The program is the original cattle show and still rated #1!

The Cattle Show is a weekly show dedicated to different segments of the cattle industry and is aired three times per week on RFD TV. Three separate shows featuring Santa Gertrudis have run on RFD-TV on DISH Networks and Direct TV (Hughes Net), as well as on cable on Comcast or Charter Networks. Each segment is sponsor-driven, and has been hosted by former Mid-Coast Junior and SGBI member, Jenna Kubecka. Several Mid-Coast ranches and members such as Corporryn Acres—Jim Corporryn, Dos Bros Ranch—Rodney and Barbara Corporryn, Harris Farms—David Harris, Wendt Ranch, Rocking A Ranch, Lazy E Ranch and Briggs Ranches have sponsored segments. The Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis juniors were definitely in Athens, Texas June 22-26, 2009 for the National Junior Santa Gertrudis Heifer Show. With the theme "Get on board the Gert Express", their display and aisle contained painted railroad tracks, "Mid-Coast" crossing signs, and "ticket" cattle signs. In the center of the aisle was the Mid-Coast Depot which had listed the days events and rates for the Mrs. Sells' donated quilt that the juniors are raffling off. Thanks to Carl and Terri Fisher, Ernest and Annette Garcia, and Dana Wilson for building and decorating our display.

The week started off with the brain bowl competition where the team of Taylor Goerlitz, Brooke Wallace, Bailey Fisher, and Jordan Hess placed third in the junior division. Zach Riley, Brett Wallace, Clay Robinson and Jaclyn Robinson aced the questions, and went on to win 1st place in the intermediate division. Our senior team of Jordan Symon, Codi Coulter, Morgan Richards and Jamie Stephenson came in third in their division.

The temperature was hot throughout the week, however at the end of each day, the pool was the place to be. On Tuesday evening at the Quality Inn, a pool party was evident along with the band "Oklahoma Stomp" from Claremore, Oklahoma who entertained from the pavilion.

As the competitions of cattle judging, cattleman's competition, and sales talk continued through the week, Mid-Coast juniors could be seen participating and demonstrating their knowledge, ultimately topping a majority of the events in each division.

During the NJSGHS Mid-Coast juniors continued to dominate the classes throughout the placings, winning 7 of the donated heifers that were awarded. Three of the four division winners were Mid-Coast juniors, with Judge Jack Ward selecting Lauren Grainger as Grand Champion and Jordan Symon as Reserve. The following day, Judge Jim Williams selected Abrian Harris as Grand Champion in the Star Five Show, while Lauren Grainger came in on top in the Donated Heifer Show.

When the week long event came to a close with the annual banquet, the excitement continued as Jaclyn Robinson was crowned National Santa Gertrudis Princess and Codi Coulter named 1st Runner-up in the Queen's competition. After the announcement of retiring Jr. Board of Directors, the new board consisting of Clay Robinson, Jordan Symon, Mason Parish, Tana Townsend and Codi Coulter were named.

Scholarships reaching over \$38,000 were also awarded to juniors who excelled in school, participation in the junior program, as well as displaying overall integrity. Although Nationals is over for this year, plans are already underway for the 2010 show which will be held in Kingsville, Texas.
