These are some ideas for a resolution or two that could help you, Mid-Coast and SGBI have a better year in 2014.



### From the Desk of ...

# John Ford, SGBI Executive Director

The last 2 years I have taken a very cautious approach discussing SGBI's move toward genomic-enhanced EPDs. Due to my guarded tactics, mem-Photo courtesy of bership may be unaware of the exciting direction that our association is Caballo Rojo Publishing headed with the pending incorporation of genomic test results (DNA) into the breed's Expected Progeny Differences. Maybe I have been overly cautious in my approach, but I think allowing time for collection of DNA samples and having methodology reviewed by industry leaders, research scientist, and members of academia before this new technology is fully incorporated into our genetic evaluation is prudent. Confirmation that the science is sound and the data is valid will allow SGBI to join an exclusive club in the beef industry. A limited number of breed associations offer their members and commercial customers Genomic Enhanced EPDs, as might be expected the American Angus Association was the first breed to utilize this DNA based technology followed by The American Hereford Association. Research is underway for several other breed associations to follow suit, with SGBI being one. It is exciting for SGBI to be in this position and the possibility of being the first American Breed out of the gate with GE-EPDs could provide a tremendous marketing advantage over our "sister" Bos Indi-

So what are Genomic Enhanced EPDs and how did we get the jump, so to speak, on our industry competitors? Simply put genomic-enhanced EPDs utilize the results from DNA test to provide added accuracy and reliability to an animal's EPDs. The benefits of GE-EPDs are the capability to gauge an animal's genetic potential at a younger age, the ability to reach breeding goals in fewer generations, as well as acquire data on traits that have an economic impact but are difficult to measure. SGBI is fortunate to have access to a large number of Santa Gertrudis DNA samples collected by progressive breeders over an extended period as well as samples utilized by scientist at the USDA Meat Animal Research Center in research activities. Combining these samples with information being received from the on-going SGBI 100 Bull Genotyping Project and additional results from breeders interested in this technology, SGBI's genetic evaluation service provider, Livestock Genetic Services, is confident the association has the required ge-

Later this spring John Genho, Livestock Genetic Services, and I will be traveling to Clay Center, Nebraska and working with research geneticist at USDA MARC reviewing information gleaned from hundreds of DNA test and evaluating the methodology to be used for incorporating the information into our cattle's EPDs. This upcoming trip and review will put SGBI a step closer to joining the elite Genomic Enhanced EPD club. .







### A REMINDER...

It's getting to that time of year when some of us start thinking about activities like pasture amendment and herd health checks.

As a reminder, the extension office in your county can provide soil sample bags and instructions for having your soil composition analysed to determine what nutrients the soil might need in order to grow more productive (translated more beef!) crops. The cost varies depending upon how much analysis you want, but Spring is a good time to amend your soil.

Also, don't forget to check with your veterinarian for his or her suggestions on herd health. While many ranchers can do a lot of what's required, it never hurts to have that professional opinion and advice. In fact, for some of us, our veterinarian is probably our closest ranching buddy. Whether you are the do-it-yourself sort of person, or the let-the-professionals-handle-it sort, now is a good time to check your records for those needed vaccinations, internal / external parasite control, and the overall breeding soundness of our herds.



#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 pound Ground Beef
- 1/4 cup beer
- 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR MAPLE-BACON BEER BURGER

Combine Ground Beef, beer and Worcestershire sauce in medium bowl, mixing lightly but thoroughly. Shape into four 1/2-inch thick patties.

Place patties on grid over medium, ash-covered coals. Grill, covered, 8 to 10 minutes (over medium heat on preheated gas grill, 7 to 9 minutes) until instant-read thermometer inserted horizontally into center registers 160°F, turning occasionally. About 2 minutes before burgers are done, place buns, cut-side down, on grid. Grill until lightly toasted. During last minute of grilling, top each burger with cheese. Place on bun with bacon.

# In Memoriam...

Mary Ryan Wilson, 88, passed away on Dec. 4, 2013.

Mary was born in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, and grew up in Calgary, Alberta, Canada, the second of five daughters born to Mary Agnes (McHugh) and James Ryan. She was the granddaughter of pioneer rancher Felix Alexander McHugh, who built the first log cabin in what is now Calgary, brought the first rail shipment of cattle to western Canada, and raised cattle and horses on his H2 Ranch.



Mary loved winter sports, and was a professional figure skater and instructor. She also worked as an executive secretary for Imperial Oil in Calgary. At an oil industry conference in Banff, Alberta, she met her future husband, John H. Wilson II of Fort Worth, Texas. The couple has four children and six grandchildren.

While raising their children, Mary acted as area representative for the American Field Service Intercultural Exchange Program, as regional director for Intercambio Student Exchange and for Other Cultures International Student Exchange. She was a docent at the Kimbell Art Museum, the Amon Carter Museum and the Modern Art Museum. She served on the board of the Gifted Students' Institute in Fort Worth, and at various times served as president of the Junior Women's Study Club, the Fort Worth Geological and Geophysical Auxiliary, and the Roundelay Club. She played an active role on the parish council of St. Patrick Cathedral and was a Lady of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem.

After their children grew up, Mary and John raised polled Santa Gertrudis cattle on their Lazy E Ranch in McLennan County, Texas, using not only the Lazy E brand, but also the H2 brand of Mary's Canadian ancestors. They were active in SGBI and took special interest in the junior program.

Mary was a devoted wife to John for 62 years. She was a loving and supportive mother, the most loyal and faithful of friends, and the most vivacious of companions.
