Beef Choices

While each kind of beef offers specific value to consumers, all beef is safe and nutritious.

Nutritional Value

U.S. beef is leaner than ever and is a premier, naturally nutrient-rich food, which helps consumers get more nutrients from their calories. 29 cuts of beef (including 15 of the 20 most popular cuts) meet government guidelines for lean, like the tenderloin, sirloin and 95% lean ground beef. Beef has eight times more vitamin B12, six times more zinc and two and a half times more iron than a skinless chicken breast.

Beef Safety

All beef goes through a rigorous inspection process and is subject to strict government guidelines to ensure the highest level of safety. All cattle are inspected by a public health veterinarian before entering the packing plant and those with any signs of illness are not allowed into the food supply.

From the Desk of ...

John Ford, SGBI Executive Director

As a breed and breed association we have been blessed to have individuals, families, and firms that have devoted more than their fair share of time and talent to breeding, promoting and marketing Santa Gertrudis. Their unwavering commitment to the breed has benefited all members of SGBI and there is no way possible to adequately thank them for their unselfish support. The Santa Gertrudis Breeders International Hall of Fame is an attempt to recognize those that have gone above and beyond for the breed. Nine individuals have been inducted into the Hall of Fame this year and Mid Coast is well represented among the 9 honorees.

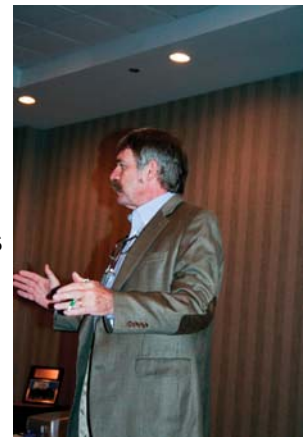

Inducted into the Hall of Fame in January during the Legacy Reception were Helen Kleberg Groves, Dan and Jane Wendt, Dick Vesper, and Dr. Charles Borchers. Recognized at the annual meeting in April were Buddy Smith, John Kiker, Fred Dietrich and Charles McMahan. The accomplishments of these individuals are many and SGBI has profited greatly from their dedication to the association and to the breed.

Early in the month of May newly elected SGBI President Charla Borchers-Leon and I were reviewing operational procedure and organizational direction for the upcoming year. As we discussed goals and plans, Charla pointed out that *coming home* would be a good theme for the year. She is right; many of our goals are focused on providing membership the services needed to be competitive in today's beef industry and much can be accomplished by returning to the basics, *coming home* so to speak.

Effective October 1, 2012 ABRA in Kansas City will no longer be contracted by SGBI for pedigree services and genetic evaluation. Livestock Genetic Services will assume management of the SGBI database and be responsible for pedigree development and genetic evaluation. Daily customer service, registration input, transfer input, and accounting functions will be handled by SGBI through the capable hands of Registration Specialist Diana Ruiz. There is probably no one in the organization more excited about these customer related functions returning to Kingsville than Diana. She has missed the daily interaction with members and is looking forward to once again having that opportunity. Returning customer service functions to Kingsville is the first step in *coming home*.

A contract has been signed with BluePrint Marketing to produce our official breed publication *Santa Gertrudis USA*. Although production of the magazine is not returning to Kingsville; the staff at BluePrint will be relying on directors and members for news, pictures, and marketing assistance. As your Executive Director, I will be assuming a larger role in the development of editorial content. The relationship with the new publisher combined with greater editorial input has the comfortable feel of *coming home*.

The breed's founding fathers stressed the importance of performance testing and data collection. Santa Gertrudis breeders were early adopters of gain testing bulls and collecting carcass data. In today's competitive marketplace, we realize as producers of seedstock we must continually work to enhance the breed's performance data set. Vice President for Breed Improvement Adolfo Sanchez and I have recently discussed actions that can be taken this year that will simplify the collection of performance data and strengthen our efforts in this area. Considering our past, this too is a step in *coming home*.

Maybe the most important component of the theme relates to former members. We all know individuals that are no longer members of Santa Gertrudis Breeders International. Let them know as an association we are *coming home* and hope that they will too.

Dear Santa Gertrudis Breeder,

The Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis Association proudly announces the Cattleman's Opportunity Sale, on **Saturday, August 11, 2012, at 11 a.m.** at the Washington County Fairgrounds Sale Facility in Brenham, Texas. Mid-Coast members invite **all Santa Gertrudis Breeders** to consign and join us for this exciting annual event. Last year's sale was good, considering the drought. This year's sale should be outstanding with a lot of demand for quality females.

Here are the sale rules and screening standards to assist you in selecting your lots. Sale cattle may not possess any characteristics under the "Disqualifications" column of the SGBI Standard of Excellence. Please call if we can help you: Tom DuBois 281-723-9716, John Kiker 979-219-0095

1. Pens constitute three head or less.
2. All cattle must be purebred registered Santa Gertrudis.
3. Santa Gertrudis females must be between the ages of 9 months through 6 years old. In other words, females must not be 7 years old the day of the sale. Fertility – a licensed veterinarian must guarantee all females safe in calf by 26 months of age and to calve before 36 months of age. Females with a calf at side over 6 months of age must be palpated safe in calf by a licensed veterinarian. Females with calf over 9 months of age must be palpated safe in second trimester by licensed veterinarian. Females with a calf under 6 months old may sell exposed or open. Any female 4 years or older must have a record of calving interval.
4. Embryos and flushes, donor cows, and bred recipient cows are eligible for the sale.
5. Top quality bulls 15 to 30 months of age will be accepted for consignment. A bull must be fertility tested and be confirmed a satisfactory breeder within 30 days of the sale by a licensed veterinarian. Bulls must have performance data and a sheath score of three or less. Bulls must be Trich tested according to Texas Animal Health Commission rules. Take your culls to the sale barn.
6. Cattle must be sound, functional, and in good flesh.
7. Please refer to the SGBI Standard of Excellence. Cattle falling under the "Disqualifications" section will not be allowed in the sale. Call if you need a copy.
8. Cattle must have health papers issued within 30 days of sale date. Be sure your veterinarian includes palpation results on these papers. Animals must be eligible for interstate shipment. Check with your vet about brucellosis testing for cows 18 months of age or older.

Any animal not meeting these requirements will be automatically removed from the sale offering.

The consignment fee is \$60.00 per lot or per pen. Make checks payable to: Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis Association and mail in with your entry form and copy of registration papers to: Tom DuBois / **Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis Association, Attn: Cattleman's Opportunity Sale, P O Box 526 Jewett Texas 75846**. All cattle will be screened at check-in with the exception of bulls, which must be pre-screened. Any consignors needing assistance of any kind, including selection of cattle, getting ready for the sale, etc; please feel free to contact any Mid-Coast board member or the sale chairman. Commission will be 10%. The consignment fee does not apply towards commission. All consignors are asked to be members of Mid-Coast or may join Mid-Coast for the first time for \$15.00. Remember, these dollars help promote our breed!

Please mark your calendars now and plan to attend! This is the major event for the Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis Association, and we are going to have a great time with plenty of quality cattle on display. There will be a Tail-gate Party organized by Kelly Vesper on Friday evening starting at 4:30 p.m., followed by a Dinner and Mid-Coast Annual Meeting with plenty of refreshments and fun for the whole family. The Mid-Coast Juniors are joining in with a Silent Auction.

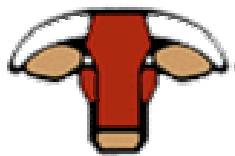
