Consignment Letter and Form

Dear Santa Gertrudis Breeder,

The 2015 Cattleman's Opportunity Sale, hosted by the Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis Association, will be held Saturday, August 15, 2015, at 11 a.m. at the Washington County Fairgrounds Sale Facility in Brenham, Texas. The Sale is open to Mid Coast members. If you are not a Mid Coast member, visit our website at www.midcoastsantagertrudis.com for a membership application. This year's sale should be outstanding with a lot of demand for quality females and bulls.

Here are the sale rules and screening standards to assist you in selecting your lots. Please contact Debbie Townsend at (979) 541-4989 or townsendcattle81@gmail.com, or Allen Grainger at (979) 337-4151 or Agrainger@aol.com, with any questions.

- 1. Pen lots consist of three head or less.
- 2. All cattle must be registered purebred Santa Gertrudis or Santa Gertrudis Star Five.
- 3. Females must be between the ages of 9 months through 6 years old (females must not be 7 years old the day of the sale). Fertility a licensed veterinarian must guarantee all females safe in calf by 26 months of age and to calve before 36 months of age. Females with a calf at side over 6 months of age must be palpated safe in calf by a licensed veterinarian. Females with calf over 9 months of age must be palpated safe in calf in second trimester by licensed veterinarian. Females with a calf under 6 months old may sell exposed or open. Any female 4 years or older must have a record of calving interval.
- 4. Embryos and flushes, donor cows, and bred recipient cows and semen lots are eligible for the sale.
- 5. Bulls 15 to 48 months of age will be accepted for consignment. Bulls must be fertility tested and be confirmed a satisfactory breeder within 30 days of the sale by a licensed veterinarian, have a sheath score of three or less and be Trich tested according to Texas Animal Health Commission rules. Bull calf prospects under the age of 15 months will be allowed to sell on the condition that the <u>seller guarantees the bull calf to be a satisfactory breeder upon reaching breeding age.</u>
- 6. Cattle must be sound, functional, and in good flesh. Any cattle falling under the "Disqualifications" section of the SGBI Standards of Excellence will not be allowed to sell. 7. Cattle must have health papers issued within 30 days of sale date. Be sure your veterinarian includes palpation results on these papers. Animals must be eligible for interstate shipment. Check with your vet about brucellosis testing for cows 18 months of age or older. As always, check with your vet for any additional health requirements.

Any animal not meeting these requirements will be removed from the sale offering.

The non-refundable consignment fee is \$100.00 per lot or per pen. This consignment fee includes \$40.00 of prepaid commission. Commission will be 10%.

Benny Leon Alexander, born June 16, 1934 in Stephens County Oklahoma, left this life on April 26, 2015 at his home in Kenedy, Texas.

When Oklahoma native Ben Alexander completed his degree in science from Mississippi Southern in 1959, he moved to Kenedy, Texas to teach chemistry. While in Kenedy, he leased land and bought his first Santa Gertrudis cattle. This was the beginning of Ben's now well respected herd of A + cattle. Ben's understanding of genetics, utilization of genetic research and knowledge of the needs of commercial cattlemen allowed him to match bulls to cows, resulting in genetic improvement and bettering the breed as a whole. Although Ben rarely ran more than 300 head, the Santa Gertrudis Breeders International Association acknowledged his tremendous impact on the breed by inducting him into the SGBI Hall of Fame this past March. When told of this honor, Ben was humbly proud, especially pleased his children and grandchildren would know he had done the best he could and had been honored by those in his business.

Ben lived a full life, raising children and cattle, traveling the world, and learning all he could, always striving for excellence in every aspect of life. He leaves a tradition of putting forth A+ effort in all you do for A+ quality results.

There are indications that the genetic makeup of the U.S. cowherd is beginning to change. However, before everyone lets out an enthusiastic yahoo, I must point out the nation's predominately black hided cowherd will remain so for the time being, but changes, ever so slight, are occurring and that is good news for Santa Gertrudis breeders and the beef in-

dustry as a whole. The nation's largest registry's advertisement campaign continues to imply participation in their value added marketing program surpasses gains received from heterosis but this strategy questioning the value of hybrid

vigor has left many industry members scratching their heads in disbelief. Simply stated, the black on black breeding phenomena of the past 15 -20 years has resulted in a straightbred commercial cowherd with little heterosis. Knowledgeable cattlemen recognize the value of crossbred calves over straightbred animals and are looking to the American Breeds to help capture lost heterosis and increase profits.

While all American Breeds have benefited from this renewed interest in adding heterosis, Santa Gertrudis may very well be the largest beneficiary due to the associations move to a DNA based genetic evaluation system. The ability to validate our cattle's performance with DNA verified EPDs has caught the eye of progressive cattlemen nationwide and sent a message to the industry that Santa Gertrudis breeders are serious about profitable performance. Our message resonates with an industry conditioned by leading registries, beef business leaders, and others that selection decisions should be based on genetic datasets. Known Santa Gertrudis traits such as longevity, adaptability and efficiency combined with the association's innovative genetic system have strengthen our position in the marketplace. Demand for Santa Gertrudis genetics is outpacing supply in many areas of the nation; this is especially true for F1 Santa Gertrudis females and it is not unusual to receive inquires at the SGBI headquarters for 50, 100, or 150 head from cattleman looking to rebuild numbers. Nothing, however, gauges a breed's commercial acceptance better than bull sales and 2015 been exceptional. Bulls marketed through SGBI affiliated events this year have sold for an average price of \$5,974.00.

I realize many of these commercial customers have no interest in receiving pedigrees or recordation papers but transferring animals to commercial customers is essential for building a commercial data base and most importantly providing a direct line of communication with cattlemen utilizing Santa



Gertrudis genetics in their breeding programs. Registering, recording, and transferring animals to commercial buyers is an investment in the future of the breed and solidifies SGBI's position in the commercial sector.


