From the Desk of ...

John Ford, SGBI Executive Director

There is no doubt that FY 2012 was one of change for Santa Gertrudis Breeders International. The major change occurring this past year was the movement of association functions back home to the Kingsville, Texas headquarters. Rapid changes in computer technology allowed SGBI to make this adjustment which resulted in the day to day operations returning to Kingsville from Kansas City. All data input and record management is now managed in Kingsville by Registration and Member Services Specialist Diana Ruiz. The association's partnership with service provider Livestock Genetic Services along with assistance from the accounting firm of Hahn and Oldham provides SGBI the tools needed to operate the organization in an efficient and effective manner. The return of services not only

allows SGBI to better manage association data but also control operating cost.

Contracting with magazine publisher BluePrint Marketing this past FY also proved to be a positive change for SGBI. The team at BluePrint has successfully moved magazine operations out of the red into the black. Not only is the magazine profitable for SGBI, it is informative, attractive, and a great marketing tool for the breed. These operating changes had a positive impact on SGBI's bottom line resulting in a very profitable year for the association.

The outcomes from the implementation of these sound business decisions are noteworthy but it is the 5% increase in purebred registrations that is truly exciting from a registry standpoint. Following review of USDA reports, cowherd inventory data, and projections most all would conclude that seedstock numbers are on and will continue to be on a decline. Looking at the national data, I suspect that Santa Gertrudis Breeders International was one of the few breed associations that experienced growth in 2012. The increase in registrations speaks volumes for our cattle and is an indicator of the growing attention that cattlemen are placing on Santa Gertrudis genetics.

Momentum is on our side. Every sale made in 2013 must include the transfer of the animal's registration papers. Breeder advertising and promotional efforts must intensify. Increased focus must be placed on genetic improvement. Our opportunity to market Santa Gertrudis genetics is great and we must not let this opportunity pass us by.






Mid-Coast T-shirts

The Sale is open to Mid Coast members. If you are not a Mid Coast member, call any of the sale chairman or visit our website at www.midcoastsantagertrudis.com for a membership application. This year's sale should be outstanding with a lot of demand for quality females and bulls.

Here are the sale rules and screening standards to assist you in selecting your lots. Please contact Sales Chairmen Tom DuBois at 281-723-9716 or Tom.DuBois@usatlascopco.com, John Kiker at 979-219-0095 or J.W.K.1934@sbcglobal.com, or Allen Grainger at (979) 337-4151 or Agrainger@aol.com with any questions.

Pen lots constitute of three head or less.

All cattle must be registered purebred Santa Gertrudis or Santa Gertrudis Star Five.

Females must be between the ages of 9 months through 6 years old (females must not be 7 years old the day of the sale). Fertility – a licensed veterinarian must guarantee all females safe in calf by 26 months of age and to calve before 36 months of age. Females with a calf at side over 6 months of age must be palpated safe in calf by a licensed veterinarian. Females with calf over 9 months of age must be palpated safe in second trimester by licensed veterinarian. Females with a calf under 6 months old may sell exposed or open. Any female 4 years or older must have a record of calving interval.

Embryos and flushes, donor cows, and bred recipient cows and semen lots are eligible for the sale.

Bulls 15 to 48 months of age will be accepted for consignment. Bulls must be fertility tested and be confirmed a satisfactory breeder within 30 days of the sale by a licensed veterinarian, have a sheath score of three or less and be Trich tested according to Texas Animal Health Commission rules. Bull calf prospects under the age of 15 months will be allowed to sell on the condition that the <u>seller guarantees the bull calf to be a satisfactory</u> breeder upon reaching breeding age.

Cattle must be sound, functional, and in good flesh. Any cattle falling under the "Disqualifications" section of the SGBI Standards of Excellence will not be allowed to sell.

Cattle must have health papers issued within 30 days of sale date. Be sure your veterinarian includes palpation results on these papers. Animals must be eligible for interstate shipment. Check with your vet about brucellosis testing for cows 18 months of age or older.

Any animal not meeting these requirements will be automatically removed from the sale offering.

The consignment fee is \$60.00 per lot or per pen. Make checks payable to: Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis Association and mail along with your entry form and copy of registration papers by

June 1, 2013 to: Allen Grainger / Mid-Coast Santa Gertrudis Association, P.O. Box 2282, Brenham, TX 77834 Commission will be 10%. The consignment fee does not apply towards commission.
