What began in the 1950's as a hobby, 25 miles southwest of Fort Worth, on locations in Kennedale and Venus, Texas, still operates today as herd # 413. John H. Wilson, Sr. needing a brand for his ranching operation, chose a sideways E or "lazy E" since those using the "W" were taken.

In the late 1980's the Fort Worth properties were sold and the ranch was relocated northeast of Waco, Texas near the town of Mart. With 1,250 acres, the Wilson's run approximately 100 head of momma cows with 80% being predominately polled Santa Gertrudis and 20% Santa Gertrudis X Hereford Star Five cattle. Over the years they have also farmed corn, oats or wheat, continually having at least one commodity in the ground, which now is leased out.

John H. Wilson II, knowing he wanted to continue the operation as a business, began taking ranch management courses at Texas Christian University. Mary also had interest in the cattle, having come from a Canadian ranching family. With the use of foundation herd bulls such as Yukon, Polar Bear, Canadian Red, Yellow Knife and Chinook, the offspring have proven themselves. In 2009, Lazy E 763, a donated heifer from Lazy E Ranch, was selected as NJSGHS Grand Champion.

The Wilson's are highly vested in SGBI, the Polled Santa Gertrudis Association—which John II was instrumental in the formation, the NJSGHS Donated Heifer Program, and the National Santa Gertrudis Youth Foundation scholarship program, among others. "The breed is important to our family", stated John III.

Dan J. Moran, Jr.



Dan J. Moran, Jr., 86, of Brenham, Texas, passed away on Friday, August 10, 2012 in Houston, Texas. He was born in Cleveland, Ohio to Dan and Marie Moran on July 29, 1926. The family lived in Oklahoma and New York before settling in Houston in 1934. After attending St. Thomas High School and Rice University, Dan obtained his B.S. in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Houston. Dan was a US Navy veteran having served two years during WW II. On November 6, 1954, Dan married Carolyn J. Farrell in the St. Mary's Catholic Church in Houston, Texas.

After spending time working in the seismic field, and oil field services, Dan obtained his Real Estate License as well as a Group I Life Insurance License which led him to represent American General, American Capitol and later Southwest Securities. Dan became a rancher, real estate and securities investor, and established his ranch Poco Mo north of Brenham. Spending time at Poco Mo brought him back to his upbringing. Many days of his youth had been spent developing a love for the country life at the family's Mo-Ranch (now the Mo-Ranch Presbyterian Conference Center) near Hunt, Texas.

Dan Moran set a wonderful example to all, he invested himself in many community and cultural endeavors, serving on boards, councils and as a member to many service organizations including; Washington County Chamber of Commerce, Winedale Historical Center (Life Member), Brenham Rotary Club since 1976, Arts Council of Washington County since 1981, Heritage Society of Washington County, (since 1977, Life Member), A Texas Patriot with Washington-on-the-Brazos State Park Association, Washington County Council, St. Thomas High School Foundation, and Independence Heritage Society.

Most dear to Dan was his commitment to the Catholic faith. A lifelong member of the Church, Dan served on the board of St. Mary's Finance Committee for many years. He also served as a Eucharistic minister. Dan set a wonderful example of living out his faith and was an inspiration to all.

A member of the Santa Gertrudis Breeders International since 1971, Dan served as director for six years and president for three years of the Mid-Coast Association, an affiliate of S.G.B.I. as well as being active for many years with the Washington County Fair, lending his support to the Calf Scramble Program, Jr. Livestock Auction, and Fair Committee for the Santa Gertrudis Open Show.

Dan was preceded in death by his parents, son Dan J. Moran, III, daughter Catherine Moran Ziess, as well as sister and brother-in-law Francese and Dr. Theo Tusa.

On Monday, August 13, 2012, the family will receive friends at the Brenham Memorial Chapel at 5:30 p.m., recitation of the Rosary will begin at 7:00 p.m. The Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated Tuesday at 11:00 a.m. in St. Mary's Catholic Church, Brenham, Texas with Rev. From the Desk of ...

John Ford, SGBI Executive Director

It is hard not to be upbeat. The demand for Santa Gertrudis genetics is on the increase. I just got off the phone with a commercial producer that recently sold 125 Santa Gertrudis influenced cows and was mourning the fact that he could have moved 125 more if only he had them. Bull sales have been on a steady increase over the past 14 months and the prices being received are very pleasing. The new bull marketing program GertBulls.com received over 3,000 views the first 45 days it was on-line and I anticipate that this number will continue to grow. Best of all, Diana is reporting that a number of former members are once again registering cattle now that association functions have moved back to the Kingsville, Texas headquarters. I attribute the positive movement to a number of factors, some operational, some related to the industry itself. However, I think that the major reason for the upturn in activity is heterosis.

Challenging economic and environmental conditions have commercial cattlemen nationwide re-evaluating their programs and the breeds, or the breed, being utilized in their operations. As I have stated numerous times over the past year, the "one size fits all" black hided breeding scheme that has been so widespread the last 20 years is losing momentum. Commercial operators are re-examining crossbreeding options in an effort to increase heterosis and improve animal performance. The utilization of crossbreeding schemes for increased heterosis is a research proven practice based on sound animal science. Crossbreeding is a cost effective system for adding pounds and strengthening economically important traits. Since maximum hybrid vigor is obtained when mating animals of breeds that are completely unrelated and the greatest boost in heterosis is achieved with the infusion of breeds that contain *Bos indicus* bloodline, Santa Gertrudis genetics are attracting a great deal of attention in the industry. Heterosis is a magnificent talking and marketing point for SGBI and we must continue to publicize the benefits that hybrid vigor provides to the beef industry. Heterosis is our breed's bread and butter.

Publicizing the benefits of heterosis is more important now than ever before. The American Angus Association recently released a new advertisement campaign, targeting commercial cattlemen, which minimizes the importance of heterosis. In fact, the marketing strategy implies added pounds obtained from a crossbreeding program no longer matter since there are value based marketing opportunities. In my opinion this attempt to downplay sound animal science is dangerous and detrimental to the entire beef industry. Disregarding the value of heterosis would be an ill-advised strategy for any commercial cattlemen. Yes, there are value based marketing opportunities available to cattlemen but the majority of cattle in the United States are sold over the scales. Pounds do matter and there is no better way to increase calf weight than through a sound crossbreeding program designed to increase heterosis; the best way to add heterosis and increase pounds is to turn out a Santa Gertrudis bull. That is our message.


